NSPCC Assemblies - Speak Out, Stay Safe

The NSPCC's 'Speak Out, Stay Safe' programme is visiting our school during March to make sure all pupils have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse.

This is a nationwide programme for every primary school aged child in the UK. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, NSPCC staff and volunteers will present a child friendly, interactive assembly to the children in our school. Specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues without using scary words or adult language.

We have studied the content of the materials and heard from other schools who have participated and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school- aged children. By the end of their visit, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.

Comic Relief: Red Nose Day Friday 24th March 2017 - Multi-Coloured Challenge!!!



The Colehill Tree: Rights, Responsibilities and Values

In assemblies this term, the children have been learning about their rights and responsibilities as learners and members of our school. The school community is represented below as a pine tree (as we have similar pine trees on our school badge) and the branches on the tree are balanced.

Branches on the left of the tree, labelled in white, represent children's **rights**. Branches on the right represent the corresponding **responsibilities** that children need to take. The roots of the tree, which keep our school community firmly anchored, are our seven **school values**.
