<p>How many different parts of your body can you balance on? Can you balance using 2 hands and 1 foot? 2 hands, 1 knee? Hold that balance, don't wobble!</p>	<p>Can you draw or write a weather report for each day of the week? Can you use symbols to represent the different weather?</p> 	<p>Do you have any flowers in your house? Can you pick a daisy? Look closely at the flower and draw what you can see.</p>	<p>How many of your toys can you pick up and put away in 60 seconds?</p> 	<p>The Easter bunny is coming. He loves to hop. Pretend to be a bunny and make an obstacle course. Can you find something to climb over or under? What can you crawl through?</p>	<p>What's in your recycling bin? Can you turn that rubbish into a fantastic model?</p>
<p>Everyone loves a den. Grab your duvet and your pillows. Where can you build yours? What are you going to use to stop it from collapsing? Who is allowed in your den? Maybe write a notice asking the wolves to keep away!</p> 	<p>Ask a grown up to make some play dough. Can you lead a Dough gym session to any music for other family members to join in with?</p> <p>Look on youtube.com for ideas, search dough gym or dough disco. Hand eye coordination, crossing midlines, developing fine motor</b></p>	<p>Can you measure different things in your house? What could you use to measure? Could you use lego blocks or a piece of ribbon or string? Make a list of which is the longest and which is the shortest? Which is the tallest and which is the widest?</p>	<p>Can you decorate one of your hats to turn it into an Easter Hat and then have a parade in your house/garden? What do you like about your hat? What words can you use to describe it? Shiny? Fluffy?</p> 	<p>Can you set up a shop? You can use your toys as things to sell. Make some price tags and some pretend money. Which toy costs the most. Which is the cheapest? How much does it cost to buy two toys? Or three? Make your own maths problems and invite people into your shop.</p>	<p>Can you look through some recipe books with pictures and choose your favourites? See if it's possible to help a grown up to follow the instructions of a recipe and make something tasty.</p> 
<p>Can you paint some letters or numbers onto the outside of your house or onto a patio using a paintbrush and water. Can you spell your name or some other words?</p>	<p>Play hide and seek with one of your toys. What clues can you give the seeker? It is behind, it is on top, it is in between, it is in front, it is under, it is next to...</p>	<p>Let's have a toys tea party. Can you write an invitation? Make a list of who you can invite. Can you lay the table with the right number of cups and plates?</p>	<p>Can you think of different places to share a favourite story? (Under the table, behind the sofa, on a bean bag, in mummy's bed...) Write a list of the places.</p> 	<p>Pretend to be the Easter bunny. Hide some toys around your house. Can you draw a map showing where you have hidden your toys?</p>	<p>Can you make up a dance that you could remember and perform to music to a member of your family or they could be your partner?</p>
